# Devotion and Inspiration: Mother Angeline's Mission

t the age of 19, Mother M. Angeline Teresa (given name, Bridget Teresa McCrory), the Foundress of the Carmelite Sisters for the Aged and Infirm, left her family in Scotland to become a Little Sister of the Poor. In 1926, she was appointed Superior of a Home of the Little Sisters of the Poor in the Bronx, New York. The more she got to know the residents, the more she came to realize that the European customs did not meet the needs or customs of America. She also felt that old age knows no boundaries and strikes all classes of people, leaving them alone and frightened.

Unable to affect any necessary changes in her present situation, Mother Angeline sought advice and counsel from Patrick Cardinal Hayes of New York. He provided her with great encouragement, as he too felt more could be done for the aged people in the New York area. In order to accomplish what she felt called to do, and with the blessing of the Cardinal, Mother Angeline and six other Sisters withdrew from the Congregation of the Little Sisters of the Poor and were granted permission from Rome to begin a new Community for the care of the aged, incorporating Mother Angeline's ideals. On September 3, 1929, the Carmelite Sisters for the Aged and Infirm was founded.

#### The Carmelite System: Strengthening the Foundation

In 1999, the Sisters formed a nonprofit corporation known as the Carmelite System for the Aged and Infirm, Inc., which was renamed The Carmelite System, Inc. in 2010.

St. Patrick's Residence benefits from the presence of the Carmelite System as it allows a system-wide coordination and collaboration to foster mission, improve quality and attain operational efficiencies. Services such as mission effectiveness, quality improvement, financial and business services, group purchasing, management of information services, strategic planning, public policy and education are provided to each member.

The Carmelite System consists mostly of senior care facilities sponsored by the Carmelite Sisters in addition to their other long-term care facilities. The facilities are located in Florida, Illinois, Iowa, Kentucky, Massachusetts, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania and Ireland. Though the services vary between locations, the homes provide skilled nursing, assisted living, independent living and short-term rehabilitation. There are currently over 150 Carmelite Sisters living and serving in the Homes. Each home sponsored by the Carmelite Sisters follows the four core values of compassion, hospitality, shared commitment and sanctity of life. The Sisters live in Convents attached to the Homes and together with their dedicated staff serve the residents with love, respect and dignity.



Located in the Hudson Valley Region of New York, on the grounds of the Motherhouse of the Carmelite Sisters, the McCrory Center is the headquarters for the Carmelite System. Opened in 2010, the McCrory Center provides the Carmelite System with additional resources to better serve our residents and facilities.

On June 28, 2012, His Holiness, Pope Benedict XVI, authorized the Promulgation of the Decree of Heroic Virtues. Mother Angeline is now known as Venerable Mary Angeline Teresa, O. Carm.


