Since 1989, when St. Patrick's Residence opened their doors in Naperville every volunteer, board member, donor, staff member and Sister has played a vital role in helping us achieve our mission. This report highlights the 2016 statistics of our current volunteers.


The total number of volunteer service hours provided by volunteers—**16,309.5 hours**.

ur hearts are heavy with the passing of Sr. Rosemary Ann Rubocki this past November. She was a lady who loved people and provided humor. Her presence within the House was quiet and calming and she was always there to greet residents' families and staff.

Her journey with St. Patrick's stems back to 1964 when she was a Carmelette, a high school volunteer program, before entering the Carmelite Sisters for the Aged and Infirm in 1969. Her first mission as a Carmelite Sister was at St. Patrick's Residence in Joliet as the Admissions Director. She held that position for four years before continuing her mission in Pennsylvania, Connecticut, New York and returning to St. Patrick's Residence in 2013. During her second assignment at St. Patrick's, she carried the cross of illness, but extended her social work training by her listening ear to residents and families offering them her prayerful support.


