Rubies are very durable. The only natural gemstone that is harder than a ruby is a diamond. Since red is the color associated with love and passion, it is no surprise that rubies symbolize success in love. They also symbolize health, wealth and wisdom.

It is a tall flower that can grow to a height of one to two feet. It comes in a variety of colors and symbolizes an open heart.

Did you know?

On July 6, 1933, Major League Baseball held its first all-star game. The game was played at Comiskey Park in Chicago and the American League, led by Babe Ruth, was victorious over the National League.





The Statue of Liberty

On July 4, 1884, France presented the United States with an incredible birthday gift: the Statue of Liberty! Without its pedestal, it's as tall as a 15-story building. She represents the United States. But the world-famous Statue of Liberty standing in New York Harbor was built in France. The statue was presented to the U.S., taken apart, shipped across the Atlantic Ocean in crates, and rebuilt in the U.S. It was France's gift to the American people.

Alexandre Gustave Eiffel, a prominent French architect, designed the internal steel framework of the statue of Liberty to keep it stable during strong winds and rain. The figure is strong enough to withstand 600 lightning bolts a year. Lady Liberty sways 3 inches, and her torch sways 5 inches during high winds.

The book she carries features the date our Declaration of Independence was signed (July 4, 1776), while the seven points of her crown symbolize the seven seas, the seven continents, and the rays of the sun. This image is meant to convey the hopeful spread of liberty around the world.
